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IN HISTORIC DEBATE, CBR GRACIOUSLY DEMOLISHES UK's LARGEST ABORTION PROVIDER

From the very beginning of CBR Executive Director Gregg Cunningham's historic encounter with Ann Furedi, CEO of the deceptively named "British Pregnancy Advisory Service (BPAS)," it was clear that Gregg had carefully studied many of Ms. Furedi's past debate videos. It was equally clear that she had studied none of his. At issue was the public display of large abortion photos outside abortion clinics. Ms. Furedi argued that it is immoral for CBR to show her prospective customers what she intends to do to their babies. Gregg argued it is immoral to hide the horror from them. By the grace of God and the generosity of donors such as you, CBR handed Ms. Furedi the first decisive defeat of her long and storied debating career. Our UK court victory affirmed our legal authority to use abortion photos. This debate victory affirmed our moral authority to do so.

CBR-UK and Christian Concern, an association of Christian attorneys, co-sponsored this debate, and a capacity crowd filled the Emmanuel Center in Westminster, London, on October 3, 2013. The debate persuaded UK pro-life leaders that we can win this war, and a number of them generously gave us the following post-debate feedback. Ann Furedi has enjoyed total control over what potential clients see outside BPAS abortion clinics. By God's grace, CBR has broken that monopoly forever. Ann Furedi chose moderator Brenden O'Neil, editor of Spiked magazine; he was a likable chap and scrupulously fair. Gregg believes we made progress in shifting his position on abortion.



Gregg argued that by trying to keep abortion photos off the sidewalks outside her clinics, Ann Furedi, a former television news anchorwoman, was being deceptive, manipulative and exploitative.

It may be difficult for those *outside* of the UK to know how significant the progress has been *inside* the UK. The significant change is not just in what we have achieved directly through Gregg's help but how much we know we can now achieve. When Gregg first came to visit us, he said he wanted to change our sense of the possible. Despite pessimistic British attitudes this has been accomplished many times over.

Gregg, being a military man, has helped me see the fight against abortion in terms of warfare. The Scottish Black Watch fought in the WWII Battle of El Alamein. Churchill said about this pivotal moment, "Before Alamein we never had a victory. After Alamein, we never had a defeat." For over 46 years the pro-life movement has only ever seen defeat. Pro-lifers are weary and cynical. One significant pro-life leader I spoke to recently told us he believed that abortion would never be outlawed.

Just in the last year due to Gregg, we have successfully challenged the restrictive speech laws so we now have an influential case supporting the use of graphic abortion images in the public square (without which social reform would indeed be impossible). We have organised two debates -- one between

Gregg and another influential pro-life campaigner, the other between Gregg and the head of the largest abortion provider in the UK. Both were arguing the same position: that graphic images should not be used outside abortion clinics. Gregg obliterated their arguments. The debate with pro-abortion Ann Furedi of the British Pregnancy Advisory Service reflected the situation in the UK. For 46 years the abortion industry has been able to successfully say and do almost anything they wish with no accountability or meaningful push-back from the pro-life movement. Likewise, Ann Furedi has said and done the most outrageous things, and those listening have just quietly nodded and allowed her to get away with it. If you watch any other debate with Ann Furedi, she is confident and in control. Her body language shows she is relaxed and sure of herself.

But she hadn't come across Gregg Cunningham before in a face-to-face debate. Gregg insisted on using logic and reason to politely destroy her baseless assertions. We watched Ann Furedi, who is responsible for the deaths of hundreds of thousands of babies, trying in vain to defend "choice" whilst Gregg forced her to defend killing innocent human beings. It was a thing of beauty.

Amongst the throngs whom turned up to see this battle were many pro-lifers who were very hesitant about the use of dead baby pictures. Now they could see the pictures are a valuable weapon in obliterating the lies of the abortion industry. I saw battle weary pro-lifers cheering (very unBritish, I must say) and suddenly gaining strength from the idea that we can be confident of our case. Since Gregg started working with us and visiting to goad us on, the debate on abortion has now shifted in the public's mind. People are starting for the first time to talk about what abortion actually is.

This debate between Gregg Cunningham and Ann Furedi to a packed hall in Westminster in October was a truly historic encounter. Gregg's passionate argument for life destroyed Ann's promotion of death and left her looking morally bereft with no concept of right and wrong. The fact that Ann Furedi has never opposed gender selection abortions and even states that the Abortion Act permits them certainly made for a lively debate.

This debate is part of the process of changing the landscape in the UK. Gregg provokes a response from the public and shakes us out of our complacency, which is exactly what we need here in the UK.

The audience was largely pro-life but a show of hands before the debate began indicated that a substantial percentage were undecided about the display of abortion photos. By the end of the evening, nearly all had embraced the CBR strategy. Unlike most reserved British debate audiences, this group applauded Gregg's more compelling points. They sensed victory at last and they loved it.

can still win the day in our democracy, and the shift in support during the debate towards Gregg's position was testimony that the moral high ground can be defended and promoted without froth and emotionalism.

Just before the turn of the millennium, prominent BBC journalist and presenter, Jeremy Paxman, wrote:

"In England, it is not that the issue [of abortion] is any less ethically charged [than in the US], merely that no one likes to make a fuss about it. The English know that abortions take place on a staggering scale in their country -- 177,225 in 1996 -- which means that for every four children born, one foetus was destroyed. There is a 'thesis' and an 'antithesis' in the issue all right. But the English simply prefer not to notice."

A decade later, the numbers were higher still. But today, CBR is 'making a fuss' and challenging the English pretence 'not to notice'. Gregg Cunningham's debate with BPAS CEO Ann Furedi was another milestone. That the debate happened at all hints at the industry's fear of imagery which reveals truth about abortion.

Throughout, Gregg Cunningham calmly refuted Ms. Furedi's arguments and assertions, highlighting how public education projects merely allow abortion to 'protest itself'. In the process, he extracted startling admissions from Ms. Furedi and shifted opinion, as the closing vote revealed.
