Here is what students are saying about GAP:

President, **U.C. Berkeley** Students for Life: “Berkeley Students for Life hosted the most high impact pro-life event our university has ever seen: The Center for Bio-Ethical Reform's (CBR) Genocide Awareness Project (GAP). For two full days, Berkeley students were educated about abortion in a way they have never been before, in the very heart of Berkeley's social and activist hub, Sproul Plaza.”

UC Berkeley -- A male student told us his public health class turned into a 2-hour discussion of GAP -- a professor come up and said how “compelling” he thought the abortion pictures were -- He said “I have always been very ambivalent about abortion.” Then he said again and again, almost to himself, “I didn't know that is what they looked like.” – A female student said, “Wow, I think He (God) really sent you to me. I say that because I'm pregnant. I WAS actually considering abortion.”

President, **The Ohio University** Pro-Life Club: “... [A] great way to get the word out.... We recruited over 30 people”

President of Justice for All, **Ohio State University**: “If as a pro-life club you are considering bringing GAP to your campus, I strongly encourage you to do so, because you will not be disappointed with the discussion it stirs.”

President, **University of Maryland** Students for Life: “GAP reached thousands of people with the truth about abortion in a way that we never could with words.”

President, **George Mason University** Students for Life: “Not only did GAP spark debate on campus, it launched our student pro-life group, GMU Students for Life.”

President, **Univ. Tenn.**, Chattanooga Students for Choosing Life: “... [We] had over 50 people sign up for our brand new pro-life group”

Assoc. Prof. of Physics & Astron., **U of North Carolina**: “I used to present endless logical arguments against abortion in the hope of changing minds. The week you were here, I realized that may not be the best way.”

President, **Middle Tenn. State Univ.**, Pro-Life Collegians: “... 15% of the passersby who filled out a survey reported that they had changed from pro-choice to pro-life.

Dr. Alveda King, Niece of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.: “As a woman who has had two abortions, I am grateful that the truth is being shown, so that others can avoid this pain in the first place.”

Pro-Choice Columnist, **North Dakota State University Spectrum**: “The fact that people are shocked and surprised by the images suggests that maybe the whole story isn't being told.”

Univ. Nebraska: “We trained over 50 of Sister Veronica’s Pius X High School Students to ‘make abortion unthinkable.’”

Temple Univ., Generation Life, College Outreach Coordinator: “Not only did I see hearts and minds touched and changed through GAP, but as a direct result of GAP, a group of Temple students are starting up a pro-life club! We received interest from over 70 students who signed up to get involved in a pro-life club on campus.”

President of College Republicans, **University of Toledo**: “I just wanted to thank you guys again for coming to the University of Toledo (UT). I really feel like it did a lot of good, as you know those pictures speak 1,000 words.”

President of Falcons for Life, **Bowling Green State University**: “Many students are uneducated about the development of unborn babies and the laws regarding abortion, and GAP does an excellent job of educating students and encouraging discussion.”

President of Students for Life, **University of New Hampshire**: “There is no doubt in my mind that GAP is the most effective pro-life project that any pro-life club can bring to their school.”

President of **Youngstown State** College Republicans: “For the first time in almost two decades, the campus was abuzz with political discussion and debate about abortion and the consequences of doing it. Even after the Genocide Awareness Project has come and gone, the College Republicans and the GAP Project have been the topic of conversation for three weeks in the school newspaper and on campus generally. Because of GAP and the Center for Bioethical Reform, the College Republicans managed to sign up sixty new members to the organization.”

President of **University of Cincinnati** Students for Life: “Initially our group had some concerns about how controversial GAP is and what would be the effect of their visit to campus. Everybody on campus saw the display or at least heard about it and at times there were about a hundred people around the display asking questions and engaging in debate. The debate was always peaceful and informed. The GAP display on the University of Cincinnati campus was a huge success because it stimulated debate and raised awareness of the ugliness of abortion. Besides the positive effect GAP had on our campus it also had a positive effect on our group, in fact 17 students stopped by and asked to join our UC Students for Life group.

“At one point someone from Planned Parenthood came to the display, she and another pro-choice student seemed to be searching for any possible means to find fault with the pro-life stance we had taken. After about 20 minutes of listening to a GAP volunteer debate with a student she commented to another pro-choice student that “this guy is really good” and then both of them left.”

President, Campus Renewal Ministries of **Florida State University**: “I recommend GAP to every group on college campuses that is passionate about ending social injustices like abortion. I promise that if you take a stand in partnering with CBR and GAP, you will not have any regrets.”
