thank God for our successful 2025 travels, bringing the prenatal science exhibit to 12 public universities, two Christian universities, four churches and a public square. Tens of thousands of people saw the photos and facts about the need for better care for mothers and babies. Our exhibits also encouraged viewers to celebrate the wonder of prenatal development.

We aim to be even more productive in 2026, and accordingly we have begun a capital campaign. This campaign is to raise funds to purchase an identical exhibit of 20 seven-foot column signs with award-winning content; 20 A-frame signs, plus two Ford Transit trucks to transport the exhibit. With two exhibits, we can position one for exhibits on the East Coast and a second on the West Coast. Traveling cross-country is time consuming and costly.

We Teach Prenatal Science Outside the Classroom

Appalachian State University

eavy wind in the October 20 forecast slowed down the set up of the 20 column prenatal science exhibit at the Appalachian State University display, but eventually the wind abated and we were able to set up 12 of the columns and weigh them down with extra sandbags.

It wasn't just the wind that was blowing hard; we also had a few blow-hard "haters," to use the modern vernacular. They arrived during construction - one wrote "Kill all babies" on the week 5 human embryo picture. Students left wooden coat hangers (wood was not used in illegal abortions!) on the ground and hung some on a nearby tree. A student declared to volunteer Pam: "These aren't photos. They're computer simulations." It was obvious that the darkness hates the light, even when all the photos are of living preborn babies.

Just as Holocaust deniers dispute the authenticity of death camp photos, a few students can always be counted upon to question our prenatal imagery. But on every campus we also operate TV monitors which display the embryonic and fetal videos from which our still pictures were derived. That settles the issue – plus we have the tapes on which the original endoscopic scans were recorded.

Thankfully, many students were open-minded, and all students who came by the display will certainly remember the photos.

East Carolina University

University exhibit on October 22, 2025, causing an interesting effect. Our entire team of staff and volunteers were hit at some point; the falling acorns actually sounded like a hailstorm hitting the tent canopy over our television monitor when the wind blew really hard.

A student was video-chatting and aiming her phone at the video on our TV as it played the embryoscopy footage of 6- and 7-week human embryos. Our team heard, "Look at the little fingers," and, "Look at the little baby," from students.

Three young men offered, "This is cool!" and, "Look at the hand. That's crazy!" before they scurried away when the acorns began to pelt them.

A woman and her young son were assisted by volunteer Bill to recognize they could scan the QR codes on the columns to view ERF. Science videos, including *The Science of Life Before Birth*. The mother and son were grateful to also learn about the 92 languages in which the script is available, plus the narrations by children in *Before You Were Born*.

East Carolina University Brody School of Medicine

group of East Carolina University nursing students wearing green scrubs came out of the nursing building on October 23, 2025.

As they saw the prenatal science exhibit, one of them exclaimed, "Week 11 is crazy!" Another added, "It's a full human in there." This message is getting across to students who are open-minded, or even to the closed-minded.

Volunteer Tai spoke with a group of female students wearing scrubs who came up to ask about the purpose of the display. Tai explained the maternal-fetal health crisis that is occurring in the US, and she confirmed for the students that the exhibit did not contain information about abortion. One student admitted she had "given the middle finger" to one of our security cameras, and she apologized. She likely realized how foolish she'd been as she recognized the scholarly exhibit was filled with information that she should know as a future nurse.
