mission. You bless us, and you bless everyone who sees our educational exhibits.

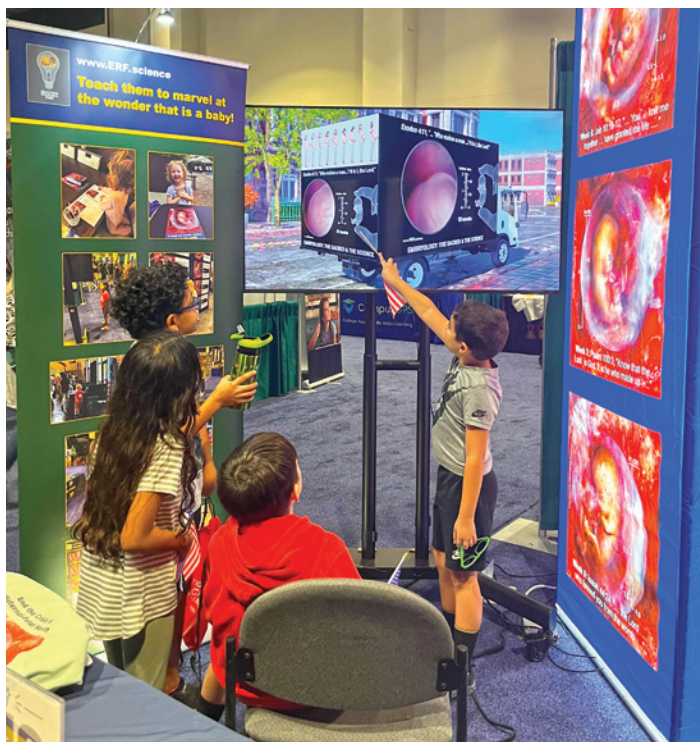
In 2026, we have traveled with our prenatal science exhibit to nine conventions and conferences, and several more are planned for the upcoming months. These are important venues for our ministry. They enable us to educate thousands of people, in some cases in a single convention.

In the past two years, CBR Executive Director Gregg Cunningham and several staff members, including CBR-Southeast Director Fletcher Armstrong, traveled to meet with many pro-life and conservative organization leaders. It was often difficult to obtain the meetings in the first place, and when the meeting began, levels of interest varied. Some leaders tried to hurry the meeting to a conclusion so they could get on to their next task. Videos of God's marvelous creation in the womb did not always reach their hearts. Even for those who were genuinely enthusiastic, that immediate enthusiasm rarely carried them forward to partner with us in a venture of any sort. We were not asking for funding; we were offering powerful embryology videos and photos and giving them practical ways they could implement them in their work so we can all save more babies.

All too often, conservative organizations are more focused on raising money than saving babies. They frequently see other pro-life groups as rivals, rather than possible partners. Think of churches: very few are genuinely willing to work with other churches.

Due to the reality that reaching out to these leaders has been mostly disheartening, we are going to their staff members and supporters. Many of these organizations have annual conventions and conferences, and they offer exhibit booths to other groups who have a service or product in which

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attendees may have an interest. There is a fee to pay for exhibit booths, but at these conventions we often obtain access to physicians and other medical personnel, pregnancy care centers/clinic directors and staff, homeschool families, pro-life and pro-family advocates, etc. We can reach the next generations of leadership. These are potential partners who would otherwise be inaccessible.

We take our prenatal science exhibits to Christian Medical & Dental Association (CMDA), American Association of Pro-Life Obstetricians & Gynecologists and Women Physicians & Dentists in Christ conventions. Some physicians remark that they have never seen embryology videos before, and the 3-week beating heart of an embryo invariably stuns them. They often ask for permission to use the videos in their practices and in educational settings. We meet medical students whom we inspire to sponsor prenatal science exhibits on their campuses. Additionally, we meet international physicians who are eager to utilize prenatal science videos in their home countries.

Beyond these conventions, we are receiving requests for help from physicians in other countries, including most recently, Colombia. One physician asked about television broadcasting privileges for embryology videos.

At homeschool conventions, we are inspiring and equipping parents to incorporate prenatal science into their teaching. We offer them powerful videos and teaching materials, including curriculum and fun tools like puzzles and coloring books. Many of these materials can be viewed at www.ERF.science. Families generally bring their children with them, and the children are sometimes our best means of getting their parents to stop at our exhibit booths. A child's natural curiosity and connectedness to babies draws them to us. At the GHC convention, a family consisting of mom and dad, three boys and grandma stopped by our new 12-foot lighted prenatal photo tower. The boys peppered us with question after question, and when the parents attempted to limit the conversation thinking we might tire of their interest, we assured them that we enjoy educating children and hearing their insightful questions. Even grandma began to engage by offering her grandsons educational facts about preborn life.

This endorsement came in from a physician we met at the CMDA convention in March:

These videos are a 'Must-See,' whether you've studied anatomy your entire life or you've never glimpsed into a

body before. The intricate detail, even at a mere 8 weeks of development, provokes wonder and fascination. For example, when I saw the scale next to the embryonic heart, I marveled that it was only 5mm in size yet had all of the arterial and venous connections.

Pakistani Baby Saved From Abortion

The married couple worked at a brick kiln in all weather conditions, even in brutal heat. Due to abject poverty and a cycle of impossible debt, when they learned the wife was pregnant, they decided to abort their baby. They feared their preborn child would face the same difficult future, but God had another plan.

Thankfully, at that very time, CBR-Pakistan brought a pro-life educational campaign to their area. The mother attended and she spoke about their family situation with team member Saima. The still-pregnant woman saw the CBR photo posters of prenatal life. The woman's thinking began to change, although she and her husband still considered abortion. The CBR-Pakistan team started praying for her and continued to remain in contact with the family. By the grace of God, they chose life, and their precious baby boy was recently born.

The phrase "but God" is a powerful reference used in several Scripture passages. Circumstances looked dismal for Joseph because his brothers sold him into slavery; yet Joseph told them years later: "As for you, you meant evil against me, **but God** meant it for good in order to bring about this present result, to preserve many people alive." (Genesis 50:20)

When the team went to visit the family, they learned about the difficulty the mother was having in nursing the baby. The team soon returned with baby formula, along with baby bottles, clothes, flour, and a few groceries for the family. These gifts brought blessings to this little family.

According to the Guttmacher Institute, an estimated 66 abortions occur each year in Pakistan for every 1,000 women of child-bearing age. In comparison, the estimated rate in the United States was 15.9 per 1,000 women of child-bearing age in 2023. The abortion rate in Pakistan is more than four times higher than in the U.S., although most abortions are illegal. Abortion numbers are getting more difficult to determine due to the increased use of abortion pills. Once they are prescribed and/or shipped to people's homes, who knows if the pills were taken?

We thank God that CBR-Pakistan continues to work in difficult conditions and with minimal finances. God is blessing their efforts, but they need our prayers and support.
